

2009 Les Cheneaux Snowsfest Kitty Cat/120 Race Rules

Please refer to Race Director for any questions

All Classes: Amateur Kitty Cat, Pro Kitty Cat, Amateur 120, Pro 120, and 120 Pro Champ.
Age Rule: Amateur Kitty Cat & 120 classes 4 to 12 years old as of February 14. Pro Kitty Cat & 120 Pro Classes 5-13 years old as of February 14 and 1 year of driving experience. Pro 120 Champ Class 7-13 years old as of February 14.

Registration must be done & paid in tent before sled is on the track. Drivers Meeting @ noon---
Heats @ 12:10---Finals @ 12:30ish

ALL RACERS AND SPECTATORS MUST HAVE SNOWSFEST BUTTON! All racers must have a legal Guardian!

Mandatory: helmet, eye protection and over the ankle boots must be worn. NO EXCEPTIONS.
Tether cords are mandatory for pro and champ classes. Strongly advised for Amateurs!

All amateur class sleds must be equipped with stock OEM chain tensioner bracket, puck and brake band bracket.

All sleds must be equipped with functional brakes, chain and chain guards.

To aid in steering safety, heim joints, steering rods and handlebar hooks will be allowed in all classes .

Fuel: Only pump gas allowed up to 94 octane with a maximum of 15% ethanol

All sleds are subject to pre-race inspections. Racers will be required to drive safely and any unsafe driving or acts of aggression or illegal equipment will be grounds for disqualification and/or penalty.

Restart rule: The flag person and/or race official will stop and restart the race if all needed

No pushing or shoving. Inside machine has the lead. Slow down if you get in trouble.

If a racer causes the race to be stopped by reckless driving. The racer can be red flagged. If a racer receives two red flags in one class, they will be disqualified from that race for the day at the discretion of the race director.

The checkered flag will determine the end of the race, not the number of laps. Situations are at the discretion of the race director!

Driver entry to an event is open to any qualified individual at the race directors discretion.

No clearing track and/or engine at starting line. Warm-up stands with ISR-approved backs and sides MUST BE USED when warming up machine with the track suspended above the ground/ice surface.

Parents, racers, spectators and other children must remain off the track AT LEAST 25 FEET while a race is under way for that day. Parents on the track or infield are only permitted if: their child has been injured; if there is a mechanical problem with their sled and the race has been stopped; or if a race has been stopped or not yet started due to a mechanical problem of some ones sled and your machine needs to be restarted. The parents should leave the track once the problem is corrected.

Racers must stay on sled at all times. Corner workers will help drivers in need.

Time to fix or repair a sled is limited to 2 minutes maximum. This comes into play only after a race has started and a mechanical problem arises.
